**ORDER ON CREDITOR FINBAR QUINN'S MOTION FOR RULE 2004 EXAMINATION
DUCES TECUM OF THE DEBTOR AND ON THE COURT'S MOTION FOR
EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE COMPLAINT TO OBJECT TO DISCHARGE UNDER
SECTION 727 OF THE BANKRUPTCY CODE AND TO EXCEPT DEBT FROM
DISCHARGE PURSUANT TO SECTION 523 OF THE BANKRUPTCY CODE**

THIS CAUSE having come on for consideration September 19, 2013 upon the motion of creditors, Finbar Quinn ("Quinn") and Life Synergies Group, LLC ("Life") for an examination of the Debtor, Mark S. Goodman ("Debtor" or "Goodman") pursuant to Rule 2004, Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure ("Motion"), and upon the Debtor's Response in Opposition to the Motion and the court having heard the arguments of Quinn and of counsel for the Debtor and being otherwise fully advised in the premise, it is

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED as follows:

1. The Motion be and is hereby DENIED. The denial of the motion as to Life is denied because it is not properly before this court as Quinn is not an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Florida or before this court. As to Quinn, the Motion is denied for lack of diligence in scheduling the Rule 2004 examination following the entry of this court's order dated July 17, 2013 granting Quinn an extension of time through September 20, 2013, to file an action objecting to discharge under Section 727 of the Bankruptcy Code or excepting Quinn's debt from discharge pursuant Section 523 of the Bankruptcy Code [Doc. 25] ("Extension Order").

2. The court on its own motion is modifying the Extension Order by extending the date for the filing of an action under Sections 523 or 727 of the Bankruptcy Code by Quinn to September 27, 2013. No further extension of time will be granted. There is no extension of time for the filing of an adversary proceeding as to Life.
