JUDGMENT

The above-styled adversary proceeding having come before the Court, upon the pleadings and affidavits filed therein, and pursuant to Federal Rule of Bankruptcy Procedure 7012, it is

ADJUDGED:

1. The Court finds that Real Motor Cars, Inc. had actual knowledge of the Plaintiffs bankruptcy case and willfully and arrogantly disregarded the automatic stay despite repeated attempts by Plaintiff's counsel to recover the vehicle before the filing of this instant action. As such, a finding of willful violation subjects the offending party to sanctions.


2. The Court finds that Real Motor Cars, Inc. shall pay to the office of King & Dolaghan, P.A., the sum of \$2,787.25 representing attorneys' fees and costs incurred in the adversary proceeding pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 105.

3. Real Motor Cars, Inc. shall pay to the office of King & Dolaghan, P.A., the sum of \$873.06, which represents the actual damages that Plaintiffs' have incurred as a result of the Defendant's willful violation of the automatic stay.

4. Real Motor Cars, Inc. shall pay to the office of King & Dolaghan, P.A., the sum of \$3,660.31 which represents the punitive damages awarded to the Plaintiffs.

5. The total amount of \$7,320.62 is awarded to the Plaintiffs and is to be made payable in certified funds to King & Dolaghan, P.A.
