Judgment

This case is before the Court on Pretrial Conference on April 21, 2009. The Defendants failed to appear at the Pretrial Conference, but in response to the Complaint, acknowledged the obligation due to the bankruptcy estate pursuant to this Court's Order Sustaining Trustee's Objection to Debtors' Claim of Exemptions dated April 1, 2008. It is:

ORDERED

1. The Defendants' remaining obligation to the estate is \$2,742.82. Defendants shall be granted additional time to pay that amount to the estate. On or before May 15, 2009, the Defendants shall pay to the estate the amount of \$200.00, and shall pay the amount of \$200.00 thereafter each 15th day of each succeeding month until the entire amount of \$2,742.82 has been paid.
2. Should the Defendants fail to make a payment as required by Paragraph 1 above, the

Plaintiff shall file an Affidavit with the Court regarding the Default. A Judgment Revoking Defendants' Discharge may be entered without further hearing ten (10) business days after the Plaintiff files an Affidavit of Default, a copy of which must be served upon Defendants.

3. The Judgment shall be entered unless the Defendants have responded with a counter-affidavit or unsworn declaration under penalty of perjury within ten (10) business days of the filing of the Plaintiff's Affidavit. Should Defendants file a counter-affidavit or unsworn declaration under penalty of perjury the Court shall set a hearing to determine if a Judgment should be entered.
