**ORDER**

This matter came before the Court on the Motion to Extend Time to File a Complaint (Doc. No. 13) filed by Sancharie Persaud, *pro se*, a creditor herein ("Persaud"), seeking an extension of the deadline for filing complaints objecting to discharge and the dischargeability of debts. The Debtor objects to the Motion (Doc. No. 15). An evidentiary hearing was held on May 4, 2009 at which Persaud and counsel for the Debtor appeared.

The Debtor filed this case on December 22, 2008 and listed in Schedule F an indebtedness of \$90,000.00 to Persaud for "personal loan for down payment on houses and house expenses." The deadline for filing complaints objecting to discharge pursuant to 11 U.S.C. Section 727 and to determine the dischargeability of certain debts pursuant to 11 U.S.C. Section 523 was March 23, 2009.

Notice of the bankruptcy filing and the complaint deadline was issued to Persaud at 119 Hutton Street, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor, Jersey City, New Jersey 07307-3008 on December 26, 2008 (Doc. No. 9). Persaud received the Notice.

Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure 4004 and 4007 allow the Court, after hearing on notice, to extend the deadline for filing Section 727 and Section 523 complaints "for cause." A motion requesting extension of the deadline must be filed before the complaint deadline has expired. Fed. R. Bankr. P. 4004(b), 4007(c). Persaud, due to illness, did not file the Motion until March 27, 2009. The Motion was untimely filed. The Motion is due to be denied pursuant to Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure 4004(b) and 4007(c).
